

GRAND RAPIDS TOWNSHIP REGULAR MEETING

June 25, 2018

The Grand Rapids Township Trustees met at 7:00 A.M. in the Grand Rapids Township Fire Hall. David Chamberlain, Ike Topp and Rita Foos answered roll call. There were four guests present.

Rita Foos moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes, as copies were made available to guests. 2nd by Ike Topp. Roll Call YES: Ike Topp, David Chamberlain and Rita Foos. Motion carried.

The Fiscal Officer presented bills in the amount of \$16,361.67 for approval. Rita Foos moved to pay all bills as presented. 2nd by David Chamberlain. Roll Call YES: David Chamberlain, Ike Topp and Rita Foos. Motion carried.

Loren Sautter told the board that after a hard rain surface water from a field washes stone out of his driveway and into his yard. Loren requested that someone look into the issue; David Chamberlain said that he would look into it.

Zoning inspector Thomas Hall updated the board on zoning issues in the township.

Rita Foos mentioned that the trees have been removed from the cemetery and that the contractor did a good job.

Rita Foos asked the board if anyone had any communication with the Zoning Commission in regards to them setting up a meeting to discuss revisions to the townships' zoning resolution. Nobody has spoken with the commission; David Chamberlain to contact Denver Geitgey.

There was a discussion on the letter received from the Lawson's in response to the letter sent to them from Linda Holmes. The Lawson's requested a waiver of the variance fees. David Chamberlain Stated that he didn't think the township should take a step backwards by waiving the fees. It was decided to give them until next meeting to apply for and pay for a variance. If a variance is not applied for by next meeting it will be turned back over to Linda Holmes.

Rita Foos mentioned that the townships' snow plow has been painted by the Grand Rapids Arts Council and is being displayed in front of the township garage.
